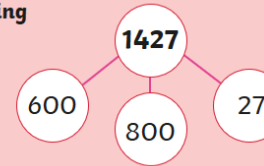

History

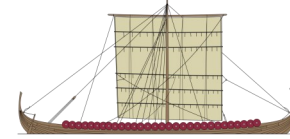
