Henry VIII

10 King Henry VIII was King of England from 1509 -1547
 20 and the second Tudor monarch. He was born on 28th
 31 June 1491 at Greenwich and was the second son of King
 42 Henry VII and Elizabeth of York. He became one of the
 47 most infamous of England's monarchs.

56 Henry VIII is well known for the Protestant Reformation,
 66 which led to the formation of the Church of England.
 77 His six wives remain a key area of historical interest. As
 86 Henry VIII had formed his own church, rules surrounding
 94 marriage and divorce were totally changed. This major
 103 change made Henry a very radical and unique figure,
 111 with the Church of England still existing today.

123 On 28th January 1547, at the age of 55, King Henry VIII
 133 died at Whitehall Palace. He was buried in St George's
 136 Chapel, Windsor Castle.

Find out what pets your family and friends might have at home. Write these down in French including numbers. Once you have found your data, create a bar chart to show your results.



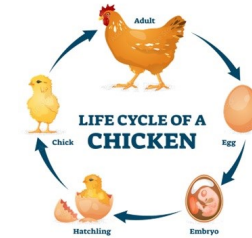
History

Choose an animal and write a factfile about it's life cycle and habitat. Use diagrams and pictures to help explain.



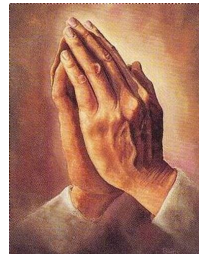
Art
