School Photos

We will be having our individual and sibling school photos on Friday 18th October. If you have a younger child(not school age) who you would like to have a photo with your school age children please arrive from 8.15. You will be given a ticket so we have a queuing system. This year the photos will be in the old year 1 classroom so we would ask you to form an orderly queue at the bottom on the steps just inside the gate to the little playground. All little ones will need to be removed from pushchairs and pushchairs will have to be left outside. We will only be able to let in a few families at a time and ask that you ensure your children are all ready as we need to stick to time to allow all classes in school to get their photo taken. Thanks for your support on this. All school age children will have photos during school time. Year 3 do have PE on Friday. For this day only please send PE kit in a bag and they can get changed after their photo as I am sure you will want them to have their photo in uniforms.

PE kits, jewellery and long hair

We have noticed that children are not always coming to school in their PE kit on their PE day. Please ensure they do this. If you are unsure of PE days they are as follows:

Please also ensure children do not wear jewellery on a PE day and that long hair is tied back. Also for children who wear head scarves these need to be the tight elasticated ones.

Laptops and reading books

Please ensure that all children bring their reading book to school every day. Children who take laptops home also need to bring these every day. We read books and use laptops everyday in school so this is essential to ensure learning is not lost.
