





<b>MATHS</b>	<p>Can you write numbers 0-20 correctly?</p> <p>Ask an adult to write numbers 0-20 on separate pieces of paper. Can you order them correctly? Ask an adult to remove a number while you cover your eyes – can you work out which number is missing? What if the adult removed 2 or 3 numbers?</p>	<p>Ask an adult to give you a number between 0 and 20. Can you draw images to match the amount for different numbers?</p> <p>You could write 4 and draw 4 buses/apples or rainbows.</p>	<p>Looking at the food that the caterpillar ate can you write some add and subtract calculations and work out the answer for example: 4 strawberries + 5 oranges = 9.</p> <p>Can you draw a picture to match the number sentence?</p>  <p>You could use some food in the house to help you count.</p>	<p>Looking at the food that the caterpillar ate can you write some subtraction (take away) calculations and work out the answer for example: 5 oranges – 1 apple = 4.</p> <p>Can you draw a picture to match the number sentence?</p> <p>You could use some food in the house to help you count.</p>	<p>Can you create a butterfly using symmetry to draw the same on both sides of the wings?</p>

Say them, write them, write days of the week on separate pieces of paper and then ask an adult to mix them up. Can you order them correctly? Draw a picture of something you do each day to match the day of the week.</p>	<p>Can you make a caterpillar out of things from around your house? You can make it as colourful as you like.</p>  <p>Use your puppet caterpillar to retell the story. Can you remember all of the food the caterpillar eats?</p>	<p>Can you write a sentence to describe what your caterpillar is doing today?</p> <p>Orange –who? (caterpillar) Red-Where? (garden/leaf) Green – Noun? (leaf/tree/plant) Yellow – verb (doing word- crawling/ moving/wriggling)</p> <p>How many parts of the sentence can you include? e.g. My caterpillar is wriggling on a leaf in the garden.</p> <p>Remember to use a capital letter and a full stop.</p>	<p>Can you draw a picture of your favourite part of the story: The Very Hungry Caterpillar.
