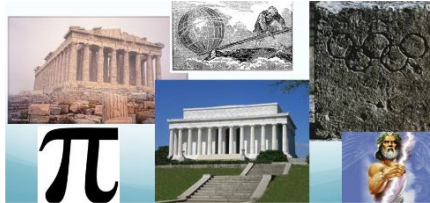
Art
