MATHS	<p>Times Tables</p> <p>There are 8 in the canoe.</p> <p>Using supermovers learn the 8 times table with Filbert Fox.</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/supermovers/ks2-maths-the-8-times-table-with-filbert-fox/z4mrhbk</p>	<p>Estimation</p> <p>Build a canoe from any recycling around the house. Test the canoe's ability to float.</p> <p>Estimate how many objects your canoe can hold before it sinks.</p>	<p>Time</p> <p>It takes 60 minutes for the canoe to travel to the other side of the river.</p> <p>They begin to travel at 12.00pm. They travelled half way across, however the black and white Great-Dane needed the toilet so they had to turn back, then start the journey again.</p> <p>What time will they all reach the other side of the river?</p> <p>Remember there are 60 minutes in 1hour.</p>	<p>Perimeter- the outside of the shape.</p> <p>Calculate the perimeter of the canoe.</p> <p>The canoe is a rectangular shape, it has 4 sides.</p> <p>One side is 52cm, the other is 36cm.</p> <p>Can you convert the measurement into millimetres?</p> 	<p>Money</p> <p>The lady who rows the canoe charges each dog £1.50 each to get across the lake.</p> <p>How much money did she make on this journey?</p> <p>The canoe can hold up to 12 dogs, if the canoe was full how much money would she make altogether?</p>



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<p>ENGLISH</p>	<p>Prediction- what might happen?</p> <p>Where do you think the canoe could be going?</p> <p>Be as imaginative as you can!</p> <p>What adventure could they all have?</p> <p>Can you draw a picture of their adventure?</p>	<p>Limerick- a silly poem of 5 lines.</p> <p>Create a limerick for the picture.</p> <p>Remember lines 1,2 and 5 must rhyme with each other. Lines 3 and 4 must rhyme with each other.</p> <p>It can be as silly as you like.</p> <p>Perform it for someone in your house.</p> <p>Investigate Edward Lear for some inspiration.</p> 	<p>Prepositions- describes where something is.</p> <p>Using prepositions can you describe where each dog is in the canoe?</p> <p>Challenge someone in your house to guess which dog you are describing.</p>	<p>Dialogue- discussion</p> <p>What could the dogs be saying to each other?</p> <p>Using role play with other people in your house.
