Collection at the end of a school day

Our number one priority is always safety.

Therefore we have to make sure we have clear end of the day collection procedures.

You should have all filled in a collection form for each child to ensure that we have the names of the people who you wish to collect your child and a password. If this changes it is your responsibility to go to the office to fill in another form.

When releasing children, we have to have 2 of the following before we release if it is not a known parent:

- Adult's name on the collection form and staff recognise the adult collecting. Must be 17 or over.
- Password given to staff matches the one on the collection form
- Message given to school office by 2.45 pm (where possible) or to staff on duty in the morning.

If staff have any concerns or queries about who is collecting they will ask a member of Senior Leadership to make a decision on whether we can release the child or whether to contact the parent to clarify.

In some cases we may ask that 3 of the criteria above are met as we do have issues with some people saying they are collecting children and parents arriving afterwards.
