NOTICES AND REMINDERS

House points

This half term we have tried to get better at the administration around house points. Whilst we want to stick to the over all aim of the children working together for the good of their house we do want to celebrate individual success so you will see today we have shared with you the names of the top scorers in each class this half term. Also we want to celebrate when children get to a milestone of earning a house point badge or certificate. Our previous system for tracking this was not brilliant and whilst we have recorded which badge most children were on we do have some gaps so need your help. After the holiday- and we will remind you) can children please bring into school any house point badges they have (ideally worn on their jumper so they don't lose them). We will send a reminder at the end of the holiday too.

Poppies

As I am sure you are aware the 11th November is remembrance day. We will mark this occasion in school by holding a silence at 11 am. From Monday 4th November we will have poppies available for a donation so children can wear these proudly as we think about those who lost their lives in war and support those who are in the armed forces now and veterans. The Royal British Legion website states: "The poppy is a humble, poignant symbol of Remembrance and hope."

Do you have a child who is due to start school next year?

In Dudley children start primary school the September after their 4th birthday. Applications are now open. The deadline is 15th January 2025. If you are unsure how to apply the school office have some paper application forms. If you want to look round reception let us know we would be happy to talk to you.

Please also remember the deadline for secondary school applications is 31.10.24 (which is during the school holiday)

Gates

Please ensure (with the exception of year 6 who are authorised to walk on their own) that all children are bought right to the gate/ entrance with an parent/ carer. We work very hard to ensure school staff are available at all entrances but sometimes they are called away or are talking to another parent. We are not responsible for your children until they are inside the school building. Please make sure they are in school safely.

Safety before and after school

We reminded you last week about keeping children standing close by to you when waiting for the Reception, year 1, year 2 and year 3 gates/ doors to open. Please do not let children play at the side of the derelict school house and also not up and down the slope as cars sometimes come up even though we ask families not to park up there.

We also need to ask that when you are in the main key stage 2 playground that children always stand next to you and do not play on the sports pitch, go into the gazebo or play on equipment. This is meant to be used under the supervision of school staff.

Star of the week




Well done to all of the children who were awarded star of the week this week- we are so proud of you

Kids eat for £1 or less

Pub and restaurant deals

Some pubs and restaurants offer kids' meals all year round with an adult purchase – check the fine print first.

print first. Bella Italia: Children eat free with the purchase of an adult main on Thursdays and for £1 with any adult main 4pm-6pm, Sunday to Wednesday.

Beefeater: Two children under 16 can get a free breakfast every day with a paying adult during the school holidays.

Hungry Horse: Every Monday, kids eat for £1 with every full-paying adult.

Las Iguanas: One kids' meal free with every adult main if you join the app.

Premier Inn: Up to two under-16s can get breakfast for free with every full-paying adult. Sizzling Pubs: One child can eat for £1 from the kids' menu with every adult main meal, 3pm-7pm,

Monday to Friday.

Travelodge: Up to two children aged 15 or under get a free breakfast for every full-paying adult.

Supermarket deals

Lots of supermarket and big store cafés offer 'kids eat free' deals or similar during the school holidays. Here are some of the best offers we've seen, where you won't have to spend more than a fiver.

Asda: Kids eat for £1 all day at Asda Cafés, with no adult spend required.

Ikea: Kids eat from 95p in Ikea restaurants. Available every day from 11am.

Morrisons: Kids eat free when an adult spends £4.49 or more on a meal.

Sainsbury's: Kids eat for £1 with the purchase of an adult hot meal from the café, from 11.30am every day.

Tesco: Kids eat free with any purchase by an adult Monday to Friday during the school holidays. An adult could even buy something as small as a piece of fruit (for 60p) and get a free kid's meal or breakfast.

Budget cinema deals

- Odeon Kids has a deal where, at selected cinemas, adults pay the same price as a child they're accompanying every day during the school holidays, as well as every Saturday and Sunday. And if you have an Amazon Prime account, you can get two Odeon standard tickets for £10, or two Odeon Luxe tickets for £15, Monday to Thursday.
 - Cineworld's Movies for Juniors screenings offer children's tickets for £2.50.
- Vue has Mighty Mornings screenings from 10am during the school holidays. Tickets for adults and children (aged 4-11) cost £2.49 each.
