School Dinners



We have a lot of children who are not eating their dinner well at school. They often say they do not like what has been chosen for them. Please can you make sure that you choose dinners with your child.

Appointments

We have noticed this week that a lot of children are being taken out of school for appointments. Where possible please try and take children to non urgent appointments either after school, in a school holiday, at the weekend or on a Friday afternoon. Examples of this might be opticians or routine check up at the dentist. We do understand that for other medical appointments changing days/ times might not always be possible. If children need to miss school for an essential appointment please ensure you bring proof of the appointment to the office so we can code this as a medical appointment on the register. This is essential as without proof this will be coded as unauthorised and could lead to a fine under new government guidance. Where possible children should come into school before and after appointments. It is very unlikely that children will need a whole day off for an appointment. We want children to be in school and learning everyday they are well enough to do so.

Silver and Gold

This week some families have asked what silver and gold awards are for and how they differ to star of the week and house points. Here is a quick explanation of all of our rewards:

<u>House Points</u>: Children can collect these for good behaviour, attitude to leaning, being polite, great work - anything positive really.

<u>Star of the Week</u>: Doing something that really impresses the adults in their class. We do try to ensure that over a 2 year period all children get star of the week.

Silver and Gold: All children begin the day on Sunshine yellow on our behaviour pathway.

Throughout the day or over a couple of days if they show excellent behaviour they can move onto super to be silver. If they show outstanding behaviour across the week or do something that is truly exceptional they can be Great to be Gold.

Recognition board: In each class there is a recognition board. Children's names can be added to this when they have demonstrated they are living out our value. At the moment this is "Compassion".

Miss Davies is the behaviour lead so if you have any more questions please speak to her.
