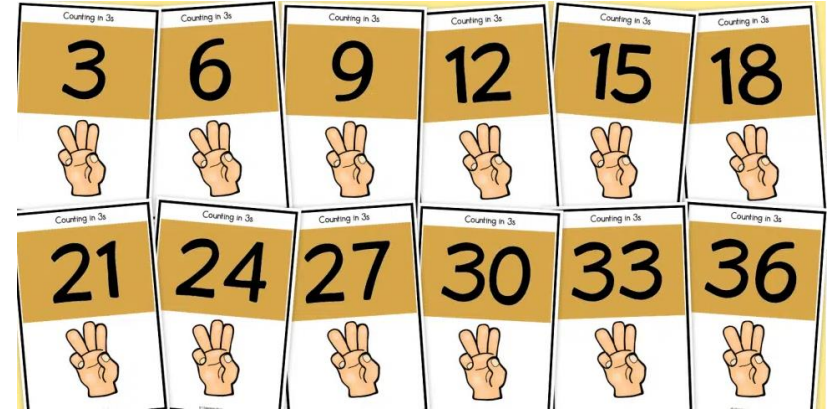
Number the boxes 1-3 to show the order the events happened in the story

What word describes the baby chicks?

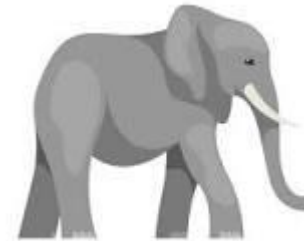
Maths

What was he famous for?



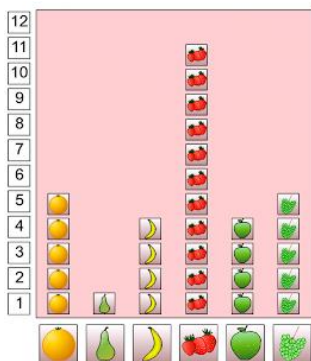
