<p>What do you already know about the story of Adam and Eve? Discuss this with someone in your house.</p> <p>Today we will focus on creation. What do you think God created and how? Creation is when bringing something into existence.</p> <p>We would like you to you search for WOW factors of nature, natural things. We would like you on your daily exercise to collect some WOW factors of nature to create yourself a crown.</p>	<p>What did Adam and Eve eat whilst in the garden of Eden?</p> <p>We would like you to create a recipe using this once forbidden fruit. If you do not have any apples at home it can be done with various types of fruit. Temptation is when a person considers to do something wrong/unwise. • Read the story board attached called The Fall and answer the Time to Think questions.</p> <p>Extension: You could create your own story board/ comic based on the time you were tempted to do something wrong and what happened- This can be based on the Time to Think activity.</p>	<p>Think about the serpent (snake) in the story.. Think about what it may have looked like... what did it eat? Was it poisonous? Where did it live? You can draw this onto paper or make it out of materials in your home.</p> <p>Compare • Try to compare your snake to those that live in the United Kingdom. (Yes we do have snakes in the U.K but they are very shy and only live in the countryside out of the way of humans!) • Find out about snakes that live here. https://www.wildlifetrusts.org/how-identify/identify-snakes</p>	<p>Today we would like you to focus on forgiveness.</p> <p>Who would be asking for forgiveness in the story of Adam and Eve? Why?</p> <p>Play a game of hide and seek with people in your house. Pretend to be Adam and Eve trying to hide themselves from God. Why do you think they thought they needed to do this?</p> <p>Have you ever had to forgive someone before? Or have you had to ask someone for forgiveness?</p>



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<p>How you do this is up to you, if you want to wear it then you could measure your head and use paper as a base of your crown to decorate or you could just place the WOW factors straight onto your head and take a photograph.</p> <p>If you didn't want to wear it how about making a rainbow with all the wonderful colourful things you collect. This could be done whilst out walking and a photograph taken or you could create a collage and display this in your window.</p> <p>If you are isolating and can't leave the house, try drawing some of the things you see from your window or garden.</p> <p>Compare the WOW factors of nature you have found or thought of to man-made WOW factors. What do you think God will think of the differences?</p> <p>Extension: You have the power to create a new animal to live on earth and create a new habitat for it to live.</p>	<p>measure them? What unit of measure will you use? Think about the equipment that you need. Think about each character's temptations that might need to be forgiven.</p> <p>Perform your prayer to someone in your house.
