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D&T- Design and create a 3D model of the battle. Don't forget the Goliath was considered a giant.

'A giant nearly ten feet tall stepped out from the Philistine line into the open, Goliath from Gath. He had a bronze helmet on his head and was dressed in armour—126 pounds of it! He wore bronze shin guards and carried a bronze sword. His spear was like a fence rail—the spear tip alone weighed over fifteen pounds. His shield bearer walked ahead of him'

If you cannot go outside you could use objects inside like rolled up socks!

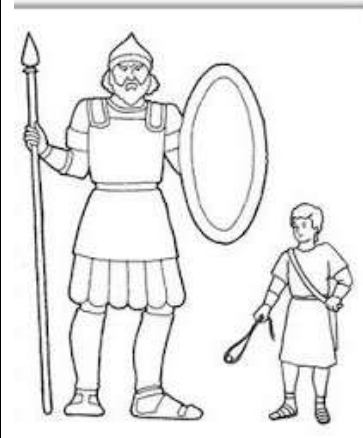
Write stuff activity-

Using the FANTASTICS, annotate the image below the grid of battle of David and Goliath. Remember to use ambitious vocabulary. Example: instead of brave use heroic. You can do this for both David and Goliath.

God. What other stories can you think of? How are they similar? How does their faith help them? When have you put your own faith in God or another person? Did your faith get you through the difficult time?

Maths- As we learned in the story, size doesn't matter if you have faith. Goliath was known to be 9 feet 9 inches tall. Using your hand figure out how many hands tall Goliath would be. Then (using your hand again) measure yourself and other family members. Compare them, how many hands taller is Goliath to everyone else. Create a line graph or bar chart to show your findings.

1 hand = 6 inches.



1 foot = 12 inches

Inches to feet -> ÷ 12

Ex: 24 inches = 2 feet

Feet to inches-> x 12

2 feet = 24 inches

1 inch = 2.5cm

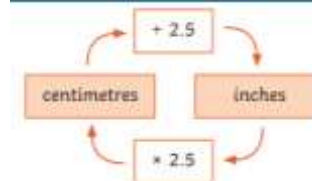


Figure out Goliath's height in cm and then convert into m and cm
