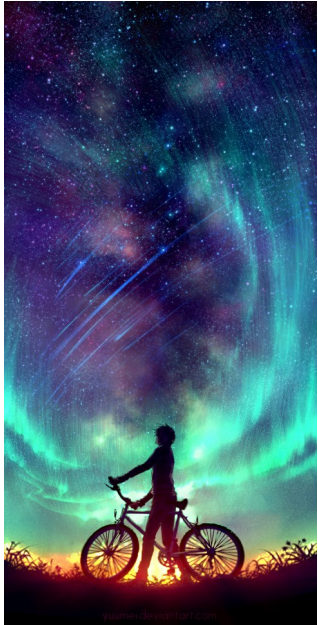

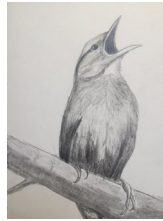
Geography

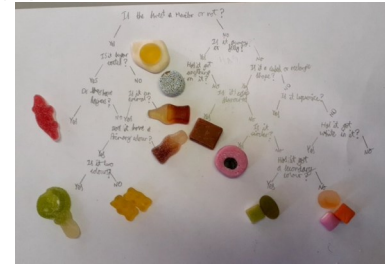
Art

Make some observational drawings of nature. Remember to add different textures to your drawings e.g line work, cross hatching and include shading where needed.



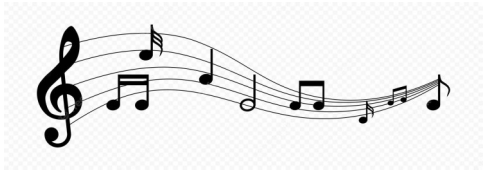
Science
