Grapes

Free school meals

All children in Reception, year 1 and year 2 are entitled to a free school dinner. However, you may also be entitled to free school meals in years 3-6 or free school meals vouchers through the holidays in Reception to year 6 if you are in receipt of certain benefits. If you do receive benefits please speak to the school office and they can help you.

Smoking and Vaping
