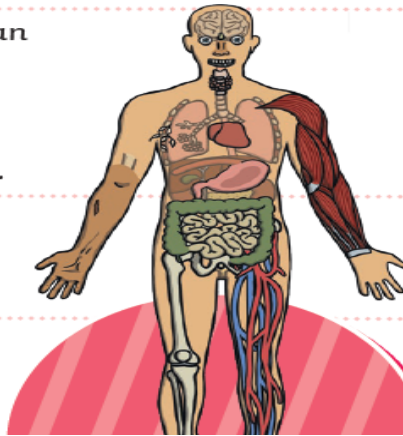

History

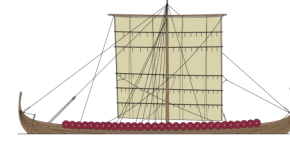
