

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

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Orangutans feed on wild fruit such as lychees and figs, but they also eat bark and insects which mean that they are an omnivore like humans.

Orangutans are great apes who can be found in Asia. They inhabit Malaysia and Indonesia where they live in the rainforests on the islands of Borneo and Sumatra.



In the wild these great apes often live alone and on average can live for 30 - 40 years if they are not injured or captured.

Orangutans depend on the trees in the rainforest for food and for shelter. They have been observed, in the wild, using large leaves as umbrellas. Because they are so dependent on the trees this means that they are in danger of extinction because of deforestation and other human activities such as hunting. There are three types of Orangutan and all are critically endangered.


Their scientific names are Pongo Abelii, Pongo <u>Pygmaeous</u> and Pongo <u>tapanuliensis</u>
