

Make a model river to see what happens to the rivers load. Use the instructions on the separate sheet to help you make your river and write down what happens.




### Science - Experiment

# Supplies

- A clear plastic bottle
- Small pebbles or stones
  - Sand
  - Sand – Soil
- Soil – Water








Put all of the sand, stones and soil into a bottle.

Draw a diagram of what you saw.



Fill the bottle with water and replace the bottle's lid tightly.



Now shake your bottle. Watch what happens to the sand, soil and stones (the river's load). Now leave your bottle to sit for a few minutes.
