

New Zealand.

Here are some ideas our staff have come up for New Zealand.

- Design a rugby kit
- Research the history of Rugby.
- Create a line graph for the population of New Zealand from 2010-2019



- Learn the haka dance (linked to rugby team)- follow the steps on the video <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=p5cHEID5cf8</u>
- Draw an outline of your face, Maori people had very distinctive and intricate tattoos all over their faces. Fill your face with these you could use it as a mask while doing the haka dance.
- Design and make Maori jewellery- could use playdough or make salt dough if they have ingredients
- Design Maori tattoo masks.
- Learn some Maori phrases
- Create a Maori art picture
- The national bird of New Zealand is a Kiwi. Find out some facts about the kiwi bird, can you draw a picture of one. One fact is that they are nocturnal (they only come out at night) go outside/ look outside as it is starting to get dark here- what animals/ wildlife can you see or hear?
- Craft a kiwi bird using house resources.
- Label the parts of a kiwi bird.
- Can you find out which animals are unique to New Zealand? (I.e they are not found in any other part of the world). You can draw or make a list of these.
- There are about 39 million sheep in New Zealand and 4.86 million people. How many sheep would each person get? Make a sheep mobile or a recipe that would include lamb as the main ingredient.
- Look at the traditional dress of New Zealand. Can you make your own design using the same colours?



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- You are traveling around New Zealand, how long would it take to get from the most northern point of the North Island to the most southern point of the South Island? By car, bus, plane and walking.
- Estimate how many steps you would walk to get to the top of Mount Doom, one of three active volcanoes in the oldest national park. What are the names of the other two volcanoes?
- Do a art collage of the flag
- Look at festivals/celebrations (birthdays, weddings)
- Research landmarks /traditional clothing and then try drawing them
- How many square kilometres has the country got?
- What is the capital of New Zealand?
- What is the country's population?
- New Zealand has a town with the longest name in the world, can you find it and label it on a map?
- Make Maori puppets in their traditional costumes.
- You are a tour guide, plan a schedule/tour of New Zealand.
- Draw a map-label using words and pictures
- Make a model (junk or paper mache) of New Zealand
- Make a cook book to include the national dish for the country.
- Make Maori fried bread
- Find A recipe for Anzacs Biscuits and following the instructions try and make some. Write your own instructions to create another biscuit and decorate in the New Zealand colours.
- Draw a picture of a landscape and turn it into a jigsaw.
- Draw and colour the flag
- Research information and make poster with facts about New Zealand

- Write an adventure story about going to New Zealand.
