Here are some ideas our staff have come up for France.

- Create a fashion magazine (design outfits, describe and price them)
- Practice simple French greetings/numbers/questions: <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/ks2-french/zr4qf4j</u>
- Make a price list for a French Bakery. Price up orders example: Croissant (1.40), Baguette (1.55) and a coffee (0.95) add them together and find the change from 5/10 euros depending on how much you spend.
- Claude Monet is a famous French impressionist painter. He enjoyed painting scenes from his garden in Giverny (near to Paris). Can you draw, paint, collage what you can see in your garden or from out of your window?
- French artists George Seurat and Paul Signac created the technique pointillismwhere their picture was coloured using small dots. Can you colour a picture using dots rather than normal paint or pencil strokes?
- In France they eat a range of food that might seem strange and a bit disgusting to us. This includes snails, frogs legs and cow tongues! Yuck! Can you design your own dinner menu of other disgusting dishes? You could draw picture of what the finished meal might look like, write an ingredients list or have a go at writing a recipe for how to make your dish.
- The Tour de France takes place in France every year. Can you answer these questions?

What sport is it? How long does it last? How long is the tour? Can you convert the measurement? When did the first tour happen?

- Make a French croquet monsieur a hot sandwich made with ham and cheese. The dish originated in French cafés as a quick snack. Can you write the instructions on how to prepare one? Remember to number your steps.
- Make creps or Ratatouille (Vegetable stew)
- Find a recipe, follow the instructions and make some Croissants. What would be your favourite filling?

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- Practice your basic French conversational skills such as hello, my name is, your age and how to say goodbye with this song. <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?</u> <u>v=9BgyvEXTZbk</u>
- Create a "Stay home, stay safe" rainbow learning how to say the French colours: rouge, orange, jaune, vert, bleu, indigo, violet.

- Make a KWL chart, (K: What I already know, W: what I want to know, L: what I have learned). Fill in the K and W sections, then find the answers of what you want to know and fill in the L section.
- Learn the lyrics to a French song. For example: Frere Jacques, the alphabet song, Au Claire de la Lune.
- Follow the weather in France and create a bar chart or line graph.
- Make a timeline showing the important events in France's history.
- There are 674 steps in the Eiffel Tower, it can take around 30-35minutes to climb. How fast can you do 674 steps?
- Make a fact file about the Eiffel Tower
- Make a junk model of the Eiffel Tower or another famous landmark
