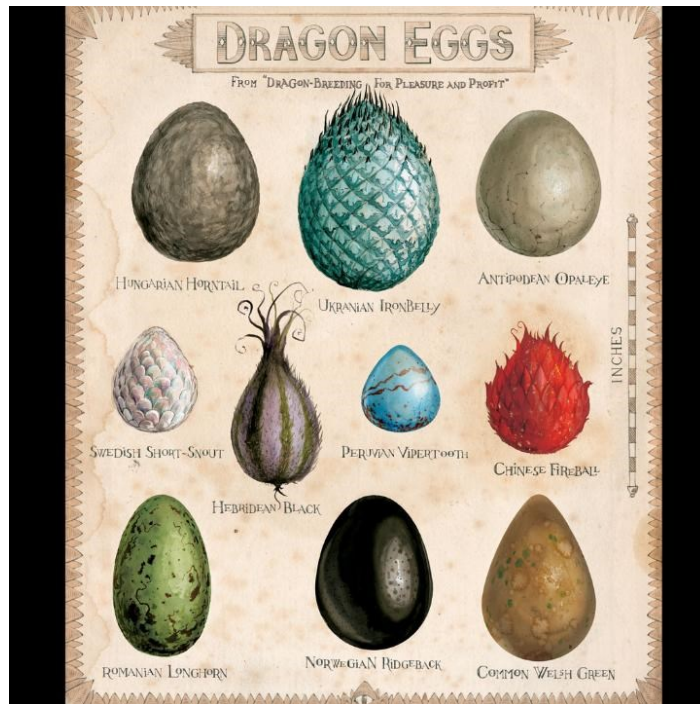


Reading
